RELEASE OF "THRILL KILLER" CONCERNS ALLIANCE

The news of early release from the Department of Corrections for Alfred Brissette, aka: "Thrill Killer" is both disturbing and unacceptable from the point of community safety by the non- profit organization, Alliance for Safe Communities.

The fact that the primary concern from the Department of Corrections is that fiscal prudence trumps community safety should be considered unconscionable.

An unwitting and unknowing community in Rhode Island has been delegated the task of co- existing with an individual who committed

one of the most heinous crimes in our states history. This should cause great concern to the residents who live, work, and play there.

Given the coverage and efforts from several entities to draw attention to this "train wreck" agenda, the status quo remained the same. Alfred Brissette, a convicted murderer sentenced to 35 years, served only 13 years of his sentence due to earned "good time credits", questionable rehabilitation programs, and the misguided judgement of an ineffective parole board's review.

The accountability of what may come from the poor judgement of those who moved forward with this decision may very well yield another innocent victim that falls prey to the nature of this monster in the future.
