REQUEST DENIAL PAROLE ALISHIA TCAKS FROM ALLIANCE FOR SAFE COMMUNITIES....

Could there be a more profound betrayal than that of an adult put in a position of authority and trust with children who abuses it by committing sexual assault?

Alishia Tkacs was convicted of just that crime. Between 2012-2014, almost daily, this monstrous predator sexually assaulted a 12-year-old girl.

East Providence police investigation uncovered evidence Tkacs, while coaching a competitive cheer leading team at that time, engaged in the abusive behavior with the 12-year-old victim under her care. Tkacs was indicted on 5 counts first degree child molestation and 2 count of second-degree child molestation.

Tkacs had been working as a nurse at Women and Infants Hospital with no reported incidents and clear criminal background check prior.

Unable to speak Tkac's name during testimony, and referring to her as "that person", the victim described being groomed and abused by the predator.

The victim described being molested for hours at Tkac's apartment and in the coach's red sedan, while being told to "not tell anyone".

In testimony the victim described 89 scars left on her body from cutting, and her desire to end her life after being raped for 2 years by Tkacs.

Alishia Tkacs victim will endure a lifetime sentence of emotional, and psychological pain from her abuse. Her will to overcome and personal strength must guide her to endure what happened.

Judge Linda Rekas sentenced then 36-year-old Alishia Tkacs to a total of 30 years with 10 to serve and the remainder suspended with probation. Tkacs will have to be registered as a sex offender for life and have “no contact “with the victim for 30 years.

In exchange the state agreed to dismiss four lesser charges of sexual assault. Tkacs could have faced up to 30 years on each first-degree child molestation count.

Alishia Tkacs crimes are abhorrent. Her sentencing was appropriate for the heinousness of her crimes, in fact generous considering.

Her eventual release will hopefully be met with intense supervision and without her ability to be in a position of control or power over any human being.

Alliance for Safe Communities asks the parole board to ensure that Alicia Tkacs serves the total 10-year sentence imposed by the courts, and parole is denied at this time.
